Wayland Town Meeting Votes regarding WFPL

ATM April 2002 - Article 21 - Planning for Library Expansion - \$40,000 - **unanimous** voice vote.

STM May 2004 - Article 14 - Connection of Public Library to Town Sewer amended “to enable the future connection of the library” cost estimate \$11,950 - **unanimous** voice vote

STM Nov. 2015 - Article 6 - Appropriate Funds for Library Planning & Design-\$150,000 in accordance with guidelines of the MPLC Program. Vote in favor: **378-49**

ATM April 2016 - Article 17 - authorize transfer of 207, 195, 193 Main St to Library Trustees, Recreation Commission and School Committee. Vote in favor: **213 - 29**

Article 18 - authorize transfer of 202 Old Connecticut Path to Library Trustees. Vote in favor: **225-27**

Article 19 - fund payment in lieu of sewer betterment assessment for sewer capacity for town library or other town building. Vote in favor: **254-13**
(These three articles needed to complete the Library Planning & Design Study work)

ATM April 2017 - Article 11 - authorize to submit MBLC grant application. Vote in favor: **202-91**
